On Monday, February 6th 2023, Governor Greg Gianforte signed a proclamation declaring that February will be Career and Technical Education(CTE) month. The Darby SkillsUSA team went to Helena and advocated for CTE programming and SkillsUSA. The Darby School District is proud of its CTE courses that it can offer the students of Darby. We offer a wide range of CTE courses ranging from Construction Trades to Principles of Engineering. Darby High School is the first school in the valley to begin a Pre-Apprenticeship program that is registered with MT's Registered Apprenticeship Program. We are also the only school in the valley that offers a SkillsUSA program. Last year seven students qualified for Nationals in Atlanta Georgia.
